D. Stephen Hogg³, fourth child of Richard Hogg² Jr. and his wife, Frances Hogg, born about 1779, was married about 1800 to Rebecca Hay, sister of Elizabeth Hay who married Stephen's brother, John Hogg³. The exact marriage date is not on record.

John Hay's will, probated September 15, 1788, named his wife, Frances Hay, his two sons, John Hay and James Hay and his two daughters, Elizabeth and Rebecca Hay, and stated that their grandfather was Daniel Presson.⁽¹⁾ In 1790 Frances Hay made her will. She referred to her four children and identified herself with her late husband, John Hay. She stated that her father was Daniel Presson. Mrs. Frances Hay left land to her son James; mentioned land that her husband left to son John, but did not expect him to live to have heirs, therefore she devised a disposal of his land. She spoke of her daughters as "my two daughters" but did not call them by names, as her husband did in his will.⁽²⁾

There was an order of Court in York County October 21, 1799 regarding the division of the property of the late John Hay in which his daughters were called Elizabeth Hay and Rebecca Hay.⁽³⁾ Thus Rebecca was unmarried as late as 1799.

The York County land tax record for the year 1807 seemed to further corroborate these two Hogg-Hay marriages when it listed, "John Hogg Jr., 50 acres from John Hay's estate and Stephen Hogg, 38 acres from the estate of John Hay." Finally, an order of York Court dated December 16, 1816 stated that the suits in chancery between these two sisters were dismissed, "the plaintiffs not further prosecuting";⁽⁴⁾ the land in question having been in their possession since 1807.

There were two children born to Stephen Hogg³ and his wife, Rebecca Hay Hogg,

1. Elizabeth Hogg⁴, born about 1801;
2. Richard Hogg⁴, born about 1806.⁽⁵⁾

In 1807 Stephen Hogg³ made his will, as follows:

In the name of God, amen, I, Stephen Hog of the County of York, being weak in body but of perfect sense and memory, do make this my last will and testament in manner and form as follows, to wit:

Item, I lend to my loving wife Rebeccah Hog all my estate, be it real or personal during her widowhood, Excepting what I shall hereafter dispose of, provided she gives my son Richard Hog the plantation that came by her, lying in Poquoson, and if my wife should not give the land to the said Richard Hog, I give and bequeath to him and his heirs thirty pounds to be raised out of my estate and if in case my son

has the said land I give the said child six pounds to give him schooling.

Item, I give to my daughter Elizabeth Hog, 30 pounds, to her and her heirs forever, and if my wife should have a child within nine months after my death, my will and desire is that it should share equally with the others, and should either of my aforesaid children (should) die before they come to lawful age, my desire is that the surviving one should have the whole of my estate.

Item, I leave my friend Bernard Elliott my whole and sole Executor to this my last will and testament as witnesseth my hand and seal this 6th day of August 1807.

Stephen Hogg³ died the last part of 1808. Commissioners were appointed in York Court January 5, 1809 to appraise his estate.

On February 20, 1809 Stephen Hogg's will was presented for probate in York Court, and "Bernard Elliott named in the will as executor, having in open court refused to take upon himself the burthen of the execution of said will, on motion of Rebecca Hogg, the widow and relict of the deceased, certificate was granted her to be the executrix, with John Hogg Jr. and James Moon her securities for bond of \$300.00." The York County Census for 1810 listed Rebecca Hogg as head of the home (her husband, Stephen, having died the latter part of 1808) with one male in the home under ten years of age, her son Richard Hogg⁴, one female just ten years, her daughter Elizabeth Hogg⁴, and herself, aged between 26 and 45 years; and one slave in the home.

1. Elizabeth Hogg⁴, eldest child of Stephen Hogg³ and Rebecca Hay Hogg, born about 1801, married Richard G. Patrick December 19, 1826.⁽⁸⁾ The marriage record stated that John Hogg Jr., her uncle, was security for this bond. He had been her guardian until she became of age. These facts help to identify her as the daughter of Stephen and Rebecca Hogg. At this time no record has been found of descendants of Elizabeth Hogg Patrick. The need for more research in this area of the family is indicated.

2. Richard Hogg⁴, second and youngest child of Stephen Hogg³ and Rebecca Hay Hogg was born about 1806 in York County. The estimation of his birth year is based on the 1810 Census, mentioned above, which listed one male under ten years of age. Since the sister was born 1801, Richard's birth could have been between 1803 and 1809. A fair approximation seemed about 1806.

Much research has been done to determine if this Richard Hogg had descendants. It seems that he did. The following evidence has been carefully examined and is presented here for your approval or rejection.

First: James William Hogg⁵ of York County born Sept-

ember 22, 1835, son of William Hogg⁴ Jr. and grandson of Zachariah Hogg³ (John² Sr., Richard¹ Sr.), in Part 2 of this manuscript, married December 29, 1857 Cornelia Hayes Hogg of Gloucester, born September 4, 1839. The Gloucester marriage Register stated that she was the daughter of Richard and Katherine Hogg of Gloucester. Some descendants of Richard and Katherine Hogg have been led, through family tradition, to believe that their Richard Hogg - ancestor came from York County to Gloucester about 1820, that he married Mrs. Katherine Morris Hall, a widow, and they were the parents of three children, Cornelia Hogg (b. 1839), William Franklin Hogg (b. 1840) and Richard Henry Hogg (b. 1842). The mother is believed to have died first, and Richard Hogg died when about 35 years old.

These dates might well fit Richard Hogg⁴, the son of Stephen Hogg³ of York County. Born about 1806; having Hogg relatives in Gloucester and being a fatherless lad, 14 years of age in 1820, it would have been quite reasonable for him to have gone to Gloucester about this time to live with some of his relatives, where he grew to manhood, met the widow Hall and married her.

A second item of evidence is the tradition in both families that James William Hogg and Cornelia Hayes Hogg were cousins, some say "third cousins". This would be true if the Richard Hogg, father of Cornelia, were the Richard Hogg, son of Stephen Hogg. There is no evidence that this relationship could have come about otherwise.

A third item, is the fact that descendants of Cornelia and James William Hogg were cousins and closely associated with descendants of Stephen's brother, John Hogg Jr. This is the most conclusive bit, because it is not clear how they could have been related any other way. This is further strengthened by a corroborative conversation in 1938 with a senior member of the John Hogg Jr. family, who personally knew Cornelia and her brothers as cousins and close friends.

Finally, it may be noted that Richard Hogg's mother was a Miss Hay and Cornelia was given the middle name of Hay or Hayes, which was evidently a family surname. Both Hay and Hayes are found in early Virginia records. Whether they are two different families, or whether the name was spelled interchangeably Hay, Hays, Hayes, as the name Hogg, Hog, Hogge, Hoge was, ___ has not been determined. While this is not conclusive evidence it is food for thought.

These bits of fact, from different family groups, all acknowledging that there is a relationship among these branches of Hogg seem to prove that the Richard Hogg who was father of Cornelia, William Franklin and Richard Henry Hogg, was the son of Stephen. Therefore, after a careful analysis of these facts by a cross section of today's Hogg descendants, the conclusion was reached that Richard Hogg⁴, son of Stephen Hogg³ married Mary Katherine Morris Hall. Their marriage date was not found, because of loss by fire of early Gloucester County records. They had three children:

- (A) Cornelia Hayes Hogg⁵, born September 4, 1839;

Richard Hogg⁴ and his wife Mary Katherine Morris Hogg owned three adjoining farms, "Dunlap", "Pigeon Hill", and "River View" all three bordering on the York River in Gloucester County. Both Richard Hogg⁴ and his wife, died young and guardians were appointed for the children. John Morris of Williamsburg, uncle of the orphans, became guardian of Cornelia and William Franklin and they were reared in that town where Cornelia Hogg⁵ attended the Williamsburg Female Seminary, and William Franklin Hogg⁵ graduated at the College of William and Mary in Williamsburg. In the meantime Richard Henry Hogg⁵ was reared by a Hogg relative, Mrs. Martha Hogg Leigh and her husband Thomas Leigh of Gloucester County. When the property, left to them by their parents, was divided, Cornelia heired the "River View" farm, where she and her husband lived and reared their family; "Dunlap" farm was awarded to William Franklin who also made it his home rearing his children there, and at his death it descended to a daughter. Later it was sold. The third farm, "Pigeon Hill" went to Richard Henry Hogg⁵ who sold it and in 1871 he purchased the Seawell's Ordinary farm. (10)

(A) Cornelia Hayes Hogg⁵, first child of Richard Hogg⁴ and Katherine Morris Hogg, born September 4, 1839, married James William Hogg December 29, 1857. (11) He was the son of William Hogg Jr. and Sarah Hogg of York County and was a cousin of Cornelia. They had ten children:

James William Hogg⁵ served in the Confederate Army through the four years of the Civil War (1861-1865). He died March 2, 1913 and his wife Cornelia H. Hogg⁵ died May 31, 1916. They are buried at Providence Baptist Church Cemetery, Gloucester County. (13)

Paul Hogg⁷, father of the three children, above, is a successful pediatrician with offices in Newport News, Va. He is affiliated with a number of medical organizations locally, on a state level, and nationally. He has contributed a goodly number of excellent articles to Medical Literature. Dr. Hogg's oldest son, Dr. John Roger Hogg is also a pediatrician and his wife Dr. Carroll C. Hogg is actively engaged in the medical profession, being assistant Public Health Director of Hampton.

The family of James William Hogg and Cornelia H. Hogg⁵ as it descended through their eighth child John Edwin Hogg⁶, showed eight children, fifteen grandchildren and twenty-six great grandchildren over a period of 72 years (1895-1967).⁽²⁰⁾

When Mrs. Ada Hogg⁶ Willett Fletcher died November 2, 1964 the following tribute from the First Baptist Church of Richmond, Virginia was printed in the Times Dispatch of Richmond, and repeated in Glo-Quips, Gloucester County Bi-weekly newspaper:

"Ada Willett Fletcher was born in Gloucester County on January 26, 1876, the ninth child of her parents. At the age of twenty-seven she married John Henry Willett, a widower with four children, whose first wife was Mrs. Fletcher's sister. They had one son, Henry Irving Willett, currently superintendent of Richmond (Va.) Public Schools.

Mrs. Fletcher had served as teacher and housewife up to the time of her husband's death in 1922, but had desired to be a missionary from early childhood. However, during these years her missionary zeal was manifested in many ways.

During her life in Gloucester County she organized a number

of missionary societies in that county. The Y.W.A. of Providence Baptist Church is named for her.

Shortly after the death of her first husband, she went as house mother to the Oak Hill Academy where she served for twenty-four years in various capacities. In December, 1925 she married Reverend James F. Fletcher, pastor of the church and school at Oak Hill. As a member of the staff at Oak Hill and wife of the pastor, she continued and intensified her religious efforts. While at Oak Hill, she was president of the local missionary society and also was president of the New River Baptist Association.

After her retirement from the Oak Hill Academy, followed very closely by the death of Reverend Fletcher, she came to Richmond and became a member of the First Baptist Church. Despite her advancing years she became an active participant in church, Sunday school and missionary activities. She entered the Baptist Home for Aged Women in December, 1961, where she spent the remaining years of her life.

Her interest in people and personal evangelism continued until she died quietly in her sleep on November 2, 1964. She was buried at Providence Baptist Church Cemetery.

Mrs. Fletcher was dedicated to God and her fellow man as exemplified in her missionary zeal. Personal evangelism was a responsibility that she accepted seriously in a variety of circumstances. No time or place seemed inappropriate to her if an opportunity presented itself. No gift

for her could bring as much happiness as extra money to give for missions or to the church. She loved people and could always find something good to say about anyone she knew, especially if someone else made a negative or derogatory comment.

Age never lessened her interest and understanding of people of all ages. For example, her last years were greatly blessed because of the love, understanding and real friendship that existed between her and Bucky, a step-great-grandson. The thing that her family will remember as her greatest and abiding characteristic was her simple and complete faith in Jesus, the Son of God. Consequently, her death simply meant to her a temporary leave of friends and loved ones here, to be in the more immediate presence of God and loved ones in Heaven."⁽²²⁾

Miss Carolyn Jeanette Hogg had the opportunity to be a secretary for the original seven American astronauts. The following excerpts are quoted from an interview by a Daily Press reporter: (24)

"What is it like, being a secretary for the Astronauts and in the center of excitement in the United States' space program? 'It was the best experience of my life' said 25-year-old Carolyn Hogg after two years of work with America's space age pioneers.

Miss Hogg, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. C. Wyndham Hogg of Gloucester Point, moved with the National Aeronautics and Space Administration from Langley to Houston, Texas

in 1962 and several months later transferred to a position as secretary for the astronauts.

Miss Hogg began her duties as secretary for the astronauts in October, 1962 when the second group joined the original seven, bringing the total number of astronauts to 16. When she left in November, 1964 the third group had been added, making the total 29. She was then one of three secretaries for the men. Before going to Texas she worked under Flight Operations at Langley Air Force Base for NASA and was in the Operations Room at Cape Kennedy when John Glen made his historic flight in the first manned space-craft."

(30) Descendants of their three children, Cornelia⁵, William Franklin⁵ and Richard Henry Hogg⁵ may be found in Gloucester County, West Point, Williamsburg, Newport News, Richmond, and York County, Virginia. Others, perhaps have settled outside of Virginia.
