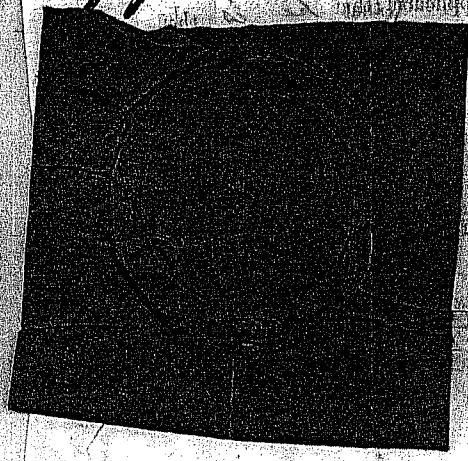

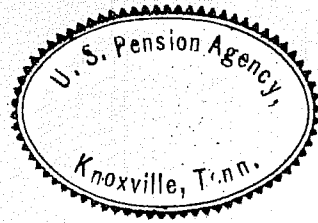

I John Hogg Jr. resident of the State and County aforesaid upon oath declare that I served in the war of 1812. I entered the service as substitute for Daniel Hogg senior of this county at about the age of 16 years in Robert Huggins Company of the 2nd Va. Artillery Commanded by Col. Kemp first then by Col. Jones at about the age of 17 by my father's consent. I joined a ~~drum~~ company that was ~~originally~~ Commanded by Capt. Thos. Cary a short time after I had joined the said Thos. Cary Company we were stationed at Stokers Barracks near the mouth of York River, we received orders by express that the British had landed at Hampton and we were put under a false march for Hampton but when we arrived at Gloucester River news came that the British had left Hampton we then remained at Gloucester River for a few days when we were ordered back to Stokers Barracks we also served a short time at Capt. Bryans in the mouth of Severn River the date I entered the service on my own hook I do not recollect but think it was in the early part of 1814 or latter part of 1813 my age I do not exactly know but recollect of being told by my father that when I joined Capt. Cary's Company and entered the service I only was 17 years of age I have no family or any other record of my age My father was a poor man and did not even give me an education I can neither read or write so I cannot speak exactly as to date but this much I do know I served in the war of 1812 in Capt. Thos. Cary's company and some days duty two and therefore think I ought to have the allowance of the Bounty Law allowed me

Cary's Company but towards the latter part of the war we think the fall of 1813 or Spring of 1814 we found in New-Company that was raised by Capt. Thos. Cary and served at intervals in said Thos. Cary's Company the remainder of the War. Those Companies belonged to the 2^d Regiment Va. Militia commanded by Col. Kemp & after his death by Col. M. Jones we further state that we were well acquainted with two John Haggys both of which belonged to the said Thos. Cary's Company and was on duty with us at the same time one of which was at that time quite a youth & was always called on the Rolls as Jⁿ Haggg Jr he the said Jⁿ Haggg Jr first entered the Service in Capt. Thurston's Company as substitute for his Father Daniel Haggg at the time he entered or substitute for his Father he was only about 16 years of age but well grown after surviving some time at intervals as substitute for his father, he joined the New Company that was raised & organized by Thomas Cary at which time he was only about 17 years of age and he served at intervals with us in said Thos. Cary's Company the remainder of the War, we know him from a boy before he ever entered the Service, we know him now and has all the time known him he has all the time resided near us, only one mile from the residence of the former and only 5 miles from the latter from ~~some~~ long ago to this present time, we were on duty with the said John Haggg Jr at a place called Stokes Branch, also at Gloucester Town and at Capt. Perry's on the mouth of Severn River he is to our certain knowledge the identical John Haggg Jr who res
