William Hogg personally appeared in open Court being a Court of Record for the County of Gloucester and being first duly sworn according to law doth depose and say that he served in the Army of the revolutionary war as follows Viz. he enlisted in the regular army of the united States or continental establishment with Capt Tho: Nelson in the Year 1775 in the month July he served two Years was in the Battles of White Plains Germantown & Brandywine and was discharged at Valley Forge by Genl Muhlensberg from 2^d Service. and I do hereby most solemnly swear that I was a resident Citizen of the united States of the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not disposed of my personal and real Estate or any part thereof so to diminish it as to entitle me to the provisions of an act of Congress of the 18th March 1818, to provide for certain persons of the Land and naval Service of the united States during the Revolutionary War nor has any person intrust debt or Securities for me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the Schedule hereto annexed and subscribed by me I further do swear that I am by occupation a farmer on rented land and am too infirm to support my self and family consisting of myself and wife myself 65 years old & my wife nearly 65 years old.

[Arrangement of 1870.]

I William Hogg of Gloucester County in the State of Virginia do solemnly swear on the holy Evangelist of Almighty God that some time in the early part of the month of February in the year one thousand eight hundred & twenty six I enlisted as a Soldier in the Service of the United States in the first ^{regimental} ~~regiment~~ Regiment under Capt. Thomas Nelson, and was stationed in Little York till some time in August following from thence the Regiment marched under the command of Col. Green to Fort Mifflin in the State of New York where the Regiment joined the Army which encamped near the Army until February 1778 when I was discharged by order of Col. Green at a place called Valley Forge in the State of Pennsylvania. Such discharge & service is among the most honorable of the State, & duplicates of which I have preserved in my possession the relief of my Country.
