 in "Gleaner's Ed., Va." (1946) by Mason,  
 Vol. I, pg. 96 - (writing Tax Lists  
 for 1740 and 1782, we find:

"Senior and Junr. - Richard Hogg\*"  
 pg. 90 lists "\*" as covering those  
 who appeared in both 1740 and 1782  
 lists showing both being 1782  
 We do not have 1783 list.

The next list we have is 1784 list  
 in "Gleaner's Ed., Va." - pg. 68  
 list is called "1780 Summary of Names"  
 in this we find Richard Hogg of King's  
 Parish, Gloucester Co. - but in  
 this list it is 1784 tax not 1780  
 according to "Hogg Family of York  
 and Gloucester counties, Va." - pp  
 19, 20, 21 Richard Hogg, born 1742,  
 wrote his will 10-16-1794 and it was  
 proved 4-20-1795. And, accepting  
 this as correct, it places the Sh. 5  
 death as lat. 1782-84

 From this evidence, it seems  
 that Richard Hogg, Sr., (born 1719,  
 died between 1782-1784); and  
 that the sons born 1748 could  
 not have been the Richard Hogg  
 for whom Navy Service pay was  
 turned over to (Adm<sup>rs</sup>) Administrators  
 Reuben "Coates" in 1786. ✓

It does not seem that  
 Richard Hogg of Richmond  
 Henrico, Va. would  
 have been the man paid - 1786  
 for services (Particulars) in the Navy  
 for 200, 200, 200, 200, 200  
 B. 62 or he was paid and  
 State Papers  
 found in "disaffair to the  
 Commonwealth of Va." This  
 was in 1781.  
 There are numerous listings in  
 Edmunds Report (8th) pg. 281, and: Hogg  
 as Hogg. We believe that there was one Richard  
 Hogg's was serving, and we

attribute a part of this Mary  
 service, to) to the Richards,  
 Hogg, who died in Gloucester  
 So, I believe between 1782-84 (in  
 accordance with evidence available)

we believe the son may  
 have been the 2d Lt - (Marine)  
 listed under Mary and Marine -  
 and who went over to (England)  
 have been listed in small state  
 (see records of the state -  
 pp. 119, 512, 479)

The (no doubt a young man)  
 probably was the Richard Hogg =  
 who was a Captain -  
 see pp. 221 - Gloucester -  
 the Annual Report (Rev. 20s)  
 "Richard Hogg - (Capt. n.) n.s. 1,"  
 in any case, unless evidence

at least is in some way later  
 proved to be in error, we  
 think it reasonable to  
 attribute the 1786 Mary  
 pay to the "Adm?" (taken as  
 Administrator) to the  
 man who apparently died in  
 Gloucester So, I believe  
 1782 and 1784.
